**Aryn:** Cindi shared with us that Alisha has made significant progress toward reaching her goals, is coming up to grade-level proficiency, and is taking control of her life.

**Gus:** Cindi has most definitely had a positive effect on Alisha and her progress. Alisha enjoys the tutoring! It's great, and I am glad you guys have this program. We love the Foundation because Alisha needs the extra help, and she is doing much better. It's baby steps, but it is also helping me to understand how I can help and work with her too.

**Aryn:** Cindi also mentioned that Alisha has made considerable steps forward, not only in her academics, but she has

seen Alisha become more confident and less frustrated with school.

**Gus:** I completely agree, and I think she hit it right on the nose! If Alisha hadn't started working with Cindi, I think she would be acting up more in school because she was far behind, and kids who are far behind typically act out in school.

**Aryn:** What would you tell others about the Life Tools Foundation and the work that they do?

Gus: I feel like you go the extra mile to keep us going, and I really want to

thank the organization for that. I have already recommended the Foundation to friends, and they have started tutoring their children as well.

From an administrative perspective, the LTF team expends much time and effort in finding qualified and passionate tutors that have expertise in particular subject areas and experience working with young people.

Our stated goal for our students is to provide them with a similar or better tutoring experience as compared to what they would receive at a for-profit tutoring company. What makes our tutors so special? First, and most importantly, they have a passion for youth empowerment; having experienced the highs and lows of working with young people, they remain

optimistic about the potential of our students and are willing to invest personally to make that full potential a reality. Our tutors have also 'been there, done that' in regard to educating students. This experience allows our educators to hit the ground running when they begin working with a student and allows them to customize their approach to the specific needs and challenges of that child.

The vast majority of our tutors are certified teachers or seasoned paraprofessionals with expertise in a particular subject area (reading specialists, special education, math interventionist, etc.). Others have advanced degrees in chemistry, engineering, English, etc. and are able to work with older students in advanced mathematics, sciences, and ACT test prep. This education provides our tutors with the ability to explore a concept from different angles until the gap is bridged, and the student fully understands what is being taught.

Ultimately, our tutors create relationships with our students. They challenge, they encourage, they listen, they dream, and they celebrate alongside the young person. Our tutors make the difference for our students; and our students make all the difference for our tutors.
